

### 2018 CA State Rail Plan: Mobility Hubs

- Hubs are strategic locations throughout the state's passenger rail network
  - Used in Asian, European rail networks
  - ❖ Larger scale stations support timed-transfers between various trains + local/regional buses
  - ❖ Interchange points increase potential for successful TOD
  - NorCal Hubs: Sacramento, Richmond BART
- Identified Mobility Hub in Solano Co




## SMART Extension Station Feasibility Report

- Identify locations for SMART rail station sites in county
  - Financed by STA, CalSTA
- Criteria:
  - Adhere to design criteria Capitol Corridor, SMART services
  - Provide safe experiences for passengers using trains, stations
  - Meet community housing goals
  - ➤ Align with 2018 CSRP service plans
- Final draft to STA Board Jan 2021




## **Evaluation of SMART Train Sites**

- Intermediate SMART train stop
- Reviewed four sites:
  - Red Top Road (new alignment at SR-12
  - ➤ Red Top Road I-80
  - ➤ W Cordelia Road/I-80/I-680
  - Cordelia Road/Lopes Road




# Key Finding: Solano Mobility Hub

- Suisun-Fairfield station selected as key intermodal station
- Opportunities:
  - Helps influence upcoming 2022 CSRP
  - Includes added 3<sup>rd</sup> track for increased train frequencies → Cap Corr Vision Plan
  - Improves Suisun City-Fairfield connections
  - Safer passenger experience at station (i.e., grade-separated access platforms)
  - Capturing new markets based on trip data
  - Aligns with Plan Bay Area 2050 jobs, housing goals




# Conceptual Layout: Solano Mobility Hub - Suisun/Fairfield Station



#### **Supporting Projects**

- CCJPA Vision Implementation Plan (VIP)
  - Multi-phase program of projects to increase frequencies, train speeds on Cap Corr route
  - Solano County 3<sup>rd</sup> track identified to ensure high frequency service plan (3-4 trains/peak hr.)
  - Work with CCJPA to include 3<sup>rd</sup> track project, Mobility Hub are in CIP
- Link 21 (formerly 2<sup>nd</sup> TransBay Rail Crossing)
  - ➤ New crossing for regional trains connecting SF/Peninsula to East Bay/Sacramento
  - Maximize use of new crossing to serve new markets supported by regional infrastructure (i.e., Solano 3<sup>rd</sup> Track)





## Next Steps

#### ACTION: Approve Suisun-Fairfield Station as the Solano Mobility Hub

- Memorializes region's position and helps develop 2022 CSRP
- Maintain coordination, involvement among STA, Suisun City, Fairfield,
   County and Capitol Corridor JPA → hub siting and development
- Pursue near-term funding for initial PSR + planning/RoW/env'l studies
- Develop <u>integrated station area plan</u> → improve connections between downtown Suisun City and downtown Fairfield; increase housing supply
- Explore <u>funding opportunities</u> (state/TIRCP, federal transit/railroad/stimulus, infrastructure finance district)
- Work with CCJPA, CSRP and Link21 teams to support station upgrades, 3<sup>rd</sup> Track Project

#### Recommendation

#### Approve the following:

- SMART Rail Feasibility Study; and
- Designation of the Suisun-Fairfield Capitol Corridor Station as the location of the future Solano Rail Hub Station Project, as recommended by the Feasibility Study.





Figure 10: Suisun-Fairfield Station, Aerial View Looking North








