## **Solano Mobility Provides Mobility Options for Commuters Returning to Work**

**Suisun City, CA** – As Solano County enters Stage 2 of California Resilience Roadmap for Reopening, the Solano Transportation Authority (STA) is continues to service the public's mobility and transit needs through the Solano Mobility Call Center, which has continued to receive an average of 100 calls per week. Customer Service Representatives are working remotely and can be reached online at [www.solanomobility.org](http://www.solanomobility.org) and by calling 800-535-6883.

Commuters and essential workers can also contact Solano Mobility to sign up for the First/Last Mile Program, which provides an 80% discount (up to \$25 off) on Lyft rides to and from major transit hubs within Solano County. Discounted Lyft rides connect commuters to local and regional transit including Capitol Corridor, San Francisco Bay Ferry, and SolanoExpress Blue, Green, Red and Yellow Lines. As people return to work, now is a great time for them to sign-up for Solano Mobility's Ride Amigos program to receive incentives. This program allows commuters to earn points while using alternative forms of transportation – even telecommuting earns points – and points can be redeemed for gift cards from popular retailers. STA is also working with our regional and local transit partners to safely restore service to the SolanoExpress Blue, Green, Red and Yellow Lines. New safety protocols are being established to protect the health of both drivers and riders:

- Wear face coverings when riding, waiting for and disembarking the bus
- Maintain six (6) feet of separation while waiting at stations (marks on the ground provided as reference points)
- Wait for other passengers to get off before boarding, and do so one by one
- Seating will be limited and blocked off to maintain separation
- The number of passengers per bus will be capped at the operator's discretion

Currently, fares are not being collected on the reduced SolanoExpress schedule; the restoration of fares are planned for June 15, 2020 and partial service restoration are being planned for July 5<sup>th</sup> – Red and Yellow Lines and July 6<sup>th</sup> – Blue Line and Green Express following a public hearing at the STA on June 10, 2020.
