5. PRESENTATION

A. Bay Area Bike Mobile

Tommy Bensko from Bay Area Bike Mobile, a program aimed at encouraging people to take up biking. Mr. Bensko indicated partnership with STA and schools began ten years ago initially as a pilot program and has since grown to be the largest of its kind in the country. Mr. Bensko described the program as more than just repairing bicycles; it also imparts knowledge about bicycle maintenance to students, fostering a sense of community and empowerment among participants. He noted that the program typically hosts around 10 to 20 events per year at various school and library venues.

B. SR2S Plan Update

Josh Pilachowski, from DKS, highlighted the updated timeline for the SR2S Plan Update. Mr. Pilachowski emphasized the immediate next steps, which involve conducting school walk audits across the county in late March/Early April. He mentioned that these audits will finalize the data collection necessary to evaluate the plan and facilitate the drafting of recommendations, expected to be completed by June 2024. Mr. Pilachowski demonstrated successful outreach efforts, including an interactive website where community members can share concerns and ideas.

9. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

A. SR2S Micro Grant Cycle 3 Update

Amy Antunano discussed the open call for projects of the SR2S Micro Grant Cycle 3 closed on February 22nd. Ms. Antunano outlined the twelve applicants with the total requested amount of \$186,000. She indicated there were follow-up items and questions for the applicants. She added an action item on project selection will be done at the next meeting. Ms. Antunano indicated staff is contemplating where additional unused funds will be allocated too.

B. Solano Safe Routes to School Program Update

- Countywide Community Outreach
 Janelle Gregorio, Countywide Program Coordinator, provided an overview of outreach
 efforts. Staff are partnering with different non-profit organizations to engage with older
 children, such as the Fairfield Police Activities League (PAL). A Community Bike Fair will
 be held on May 1st at Green Valley Middle School.
- ii. Benicia/Vallejo School Districts
 Suzanne Antone reported sixteen events before June 30 in the cities of Benicia and Vallejo.
 She continued to highlight different partnerships being utilized, such as Music Notes and Greater Vallejo Recreational District (GVRD).

- iii. Dixon/Fairfield/Suisun City School Districts
 Janelle Gregorio indicated Crystal Peacher was attending a Bike Mobile in Fairfield. She outlined ten events being held in the three cities. She continued to highlight Ms. Peacher's customization of helmet fitting services to enhance efficiency, particularly for schools. Ms. Gregorio concluded that Dixon's Anderson Elementary is currently closed.
- iv. Rio Vista/Travis AFB/Vacaville School Districts
 Leigh Moilanen shared that her respective districts have twelve events planned through
 June. Bicycle Advisory Committee (BAC) member Dennis Elliot has written articles in the
 Rio Vista Newspaper promoting local events. She concluded by introducing a new pilot
 event named "Safety Day" at three interested schools, aimed at offering safety tips to
 students.

C. SR2S Highschool Safety Video Project Update

Dail Montanez reported progress on extending the SR2S High School Safety Video Project to two schools, Rodriguez, and Fairfield High Schools. She continued to mention filming for the students would begin at the end of February. She concluded that selected videos will be presented in next month's meeting and used to promote Bike Month in May.

D. Enforcement Updates

- Benicia Police Department
 Officer Diosdado noted they are dealing with issues during pick-up and drop-off where drivers are blocking crosswalks making it difficult for students to cross safely.
- ii. Suisun City Police Department
 Officer Henderson mentioned Officer Ivy Kuntz will be providing updates moving
 forwardHe concluded by addressing the challenge of students attempting "wheelies" while
 their peers film. This is a social media trend that the department is trying to address before
 it becomes a bigger issues..

E. Community Task Force Updates

- i. City of Fairfield
 - Tina Machado indicated the City of Fairfield and Fairfield Suisun Unified School District (FSUSD) have partnered to apply for the SR2S Micro Grant Program for elementary schools. She highlighted five new High-intensity Activated Crosswalks (HAWK) locations. Ms. Machado will present new data collected and traffic tips in the next meeting.
- ii. City of Vacaville
 - Rochelle Wise announced the City of Vacaville released a call for projects to be included in the SR2S Micro Grant. She noted 129 submittals across 19 schools were received. She focused on the City of Vacaville's new evaluation program that will improve grant competitiveness.
- iii. City of Vallejo
 Mitch Romao provided an overview of essential needs for the Vallejo City Unified School
 District (VCUSD). Mr. Romao outlined priorities to provide signage for the schools and
 repainting crosswalks.

10. COMMITTEE ROUNDTABLE AND FUTURE AGENDA TOPICS.

David Belef mentioned Greater Vallejo Recreational District (GVRD) is interested in implementing more bike safety and educational programs. He concluded with the City of Napa holding a bike festival on May 5th

RE: Solano Safe Routes to School Program Update (by District/City)

Background:

The Solano Safe Routes to School (SR2S) Program aims to boost the participation of students in walking and bicycling to school by ensuring a safe, enjoyable, and healthy journey. Employing an inclusive strategy, the program incorporates six key elements, often referred to as the 6 E's: education, encouragement, enforcement, engineering, engagement, and evaluation. This initiative is accessible to all schools throughout the county and centers its efforts on implementing activities and programs that educate students about safety, promote health awareness, and identify opportunities for enhancements within communities countywide, ultimately fostering safer travel for students engaged in active modes of transportation.

In 2008, the STA Board adopted Solano's first Safe Routes to School Plan (Plan) and authorized STA staff to create a Safe Routes to School Program in Solano County. This Plan provided the direction for the SR2S Program through 2012 when the STA and the various SR2S Advisory Committees began the process of updating the 2008 Plan. The updated Plan was adopted by the STA Board in October 2013. STA Staff is currently engaging the Community Task Forces in each city in preparation for the 2024 Plan update which includes evaluating the effectiveness of the Program.

Discussion:

One of the Program's primary goals is to work with schools to invest in changing the culture to a more walkable and bikeable school sites. Below is an update of SR2S activities happening in each city:

Benicia

- SR2S has been invited to hold a Bike Mobile and Helmet Fitting event at Benicia Public Library in collaboration with Food Is Free Bay Area on June 8th.
- Hogan Middle School hosted the Bike Mobile team on April 16, 2024. Eighteen bicycles were repaired, and 11 helmets were fitted and handed out to students.
- On National Bike to School Day, Program Coordinator held a helmet fitting event in the main area of Benicia High School during their lunch hour. Benicia Bicycle Club members, Nancy Lund and Craig Elliott, along with Benicia Police Department CSO,

Elizabeth Carrillo, also attended the event.

Fairfield/Suisun City

- Program Coordinator organized a Community Bike Workshop on Wednesday, May 1st, 2024, hosted by Green Valley Middle School. Bay Area Bike Mobile and Safe Moves Bike Rodeo was the focus along with SR2S program coordinators conducting a helmet fitting and giveaway. Other small, local businesses were invited to attend. Overall, there were an estimated 200 participants with 51 bikes serviced and 42 helmets fitted.
- Green Valley Middle School launched their Walk or Wheel Program scheduled for every Wednesday. Every third Wednesday of the month, the site principal, coordinators, and volunteers will hand out charms as incentives. Over 200 students were estimated to have participated in utilizing active transportation methods.
- Program Coordinators are working on a Safety Day that will be piloted at three different schools throughout the county. The "day" will be held assembly style during the school day and will consist of short presentations from the following agencies invited: local police agencies, local fire department, Solano County Animal Control, Solano County Offices of Emergency Services, Coast Guard Search and Rescue, and CHP along with the CHP Helicopter.
- David Weir Preparatory Academy hosted the Bike Mobile team on March 4, 2024. Fourteen bikes were serviced.
- Nelda Mundy Elementary School hosted the Bike Mobile team on May 10, 2024. Twenty-six bikes were serviced.

Rio Vista

 Rio Vista held a Community Bike Fair hosted at DH White Elementary School. Twentyone bikes were serviced. SR2S was also joined by Solano Mobility to help promote Bike Month.

Vacaville/Travis

- Scandia Elementary School hosted the Bike Mobile team on February 28, 2024. Thirty-one bikes were serviced with over 50 students and families in attendance.
- Fairmont Charter School hosted the Bike Mobile team on March 13, 2024. Twelve bikes were serviced.

Vallejo

- Program Coordinator attended Family Night events at Cooper and Grace Patterson Elementary School on March 13, 2024.
- A Bike Rodeo is scheduled for Pennycook Elementary School on Friday, May 24, 2024.
- Community Bike Mobile events are scheduled for Wednesday, June 12, 2024 at Springstowne Library, and Thursday, June 20, 2024 at John F. Kennedy Library.

RE: Safe Routes to Schools (SR2S) Micro-Grant Update

Background:

In November 2019, the STA Board launched a Safe Routes to School (SR2S) Micro-Grant Pilot Program to support small-scale projects or capital purchases that improves bike and pedestrian usage and safety around schools in Solano County. Elibable applicants include, Solano County schools, school districts, cities and/or CBO's or nonprofit organizations. Two cycles have been conducted, resulting in the funding of 30 projects totaling \$271,575. Types of projects include installation of Radar Feedback signs, Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon, Crosswalk restripping, and installation of skateboard and bike racks. To date, all projects have been completed.

The STA Board authorized the SR2S Micro Grant Cycle 3 with \$212,172 in TDA Article 3 funds. On December 22nd, 2023, application period opened for six weeks, and closed February 2, 2024, at 5:00pm. Cycle 3 of the Micro Grant was advertised to Solano County cities, schools, school districts, community-based organizations, the STA Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committees, and the public through the SR2S website, emails, social media posts, and stakeholder meeting announcements. Twelve applications totaling \$186,450.58 were received by the deadline.

Discussion:

Appplications for the Cycle 3 Micro Grant were reviewed and scored by the Micro Grant sub-committee with funding recommendations proposed (attachment A) based on the scoring rubric including project proposal, letters of support from stakeholders, specific plan for implementation of the project, project timeline, and how incentive and equipment proposals encourage or support safety and/or walk and bike programs. Projects proposed that serve a Title 1 school, Community of Concern or underserved community received extra consideration.

Based on the sub-committee review and recommendation, the requested amount aligns well with the intent of allocated funds. Staff recommends approving all twelve applications. Additionally, with the remaining balance of \$25,721.42, the staff proposes issuing a second Call for Projects in the Fall of 2024.

Fiscal Impact:

The SR2S Microgrant Program is funded by TDA Article 3 funds.

RE: Solano Safe Routes to School (SR2S) Plan Update

Background:

The Solano Safe Routes to School (SR2S) Program works to increase the number of students walking and bicycling to school by helping to make the journey safe, fun, and healthy. Using a comprehensive approach, the program includes 6 "E's": education, encouragement, enforcement, engineering, engagement, and evaluation. The Program is available to all schools countywide and focuses on activities and programs that educate students on safety, health awareness and identifying improvements within communities countywide to enhance active student travel safety.

In 2008, the STA Board adopted Solano's first Safe Routes to School Plan (Plan) and authorized STA staff to create a Safe Routes to School Program in Solano County. This Plan provided the direction for the SR2S Program. In June 2023, STA Staff initiated the 3rd iteration of the Safe Routes to School Plan Update with selected consultants, DKS and Associates. Staff, along with its partner agency, Solano Public Health, reengaged with Community Task Forces in each city to discuss the Plan update as well as the Program's 5-year vision, which includes evaluating the effectiveness of the Program. During the Fall of 2023 Safe Routes to School Staff, along with the Consultant implemented a public communications and outreach plan to solicit feedback from the community on their vision for bicycling and walking in Solano County.

Discussion:

Staff have continued to work with the Solano County Community Task Forces to prioritize schools in their respective cities that will be evaluated for walk audits in the Spring. Once the audits have been completed, a Recommendations Report including a base map of each walk audit will be shared with STA partners and the schools assessed. These selected schools can be viewed in Attachment A. Additionally, DKS and Associates are also working to develop comprehensive evaluation metrics and performance measures to analyze the efficacy of components of the Safe Routes to School program. The Plan is scheduled to be completed by the Fall of 2024.

Fiscal Impact:

Funding through the Metropolitan Transportation Commission's (MTC) Quick-Strike, One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) and The Office of Traffic and Safety (OTS) approved by the STA board in June 2023.
