2. APPROVAL OF THE EWG MEETING MINUTES OF FEBUARY 28, 2024

The Equity Working Group (EWG) unanimously approved the agenda.

3. VALLEJO SOLSTEP PROJECT-PROJECT UPDATE

Debbie McQuilkin from STA introduced the SolSTEP Project and provided a brief overview of the project history, and the roles of the STA, Club Stride and the Equity Working Group on the project. Following, Edwin Cortez from Club Stride provide an update on their work with Vallejo youth on developing the youth-focused community-based transportation plan.

Committee Member/Public Comment:

Michael Wilson suggested the Vallejo County Fair in June 2024 as a potential outreach opportunity for Club Stride to consider for this effort.

4. EQUITY FRAMEWORK FOR COMPREHENSIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN (CTP) UPDATE

Kathrina Gregana, STA presented the draft Solano Equity Framework based on input and feedback from the EWG and previewed the identified equity areas based on the framework that was developed. She added that STA staff is requesting approval of the framework to forward to the STA Board and added that the approval of the Equity Framework will allow STA staff to use this tool as part of their CTP Update effort.

Committee members requested minor edits to the maps that were presented to improve clarity, such as revising the metric labels in the legend, making the block group lines more prominent, and the addition of footnotes to define terms and cite data sources.

Several committee members asked questions about the identified equity areas in their jurisdiction and why certain block groups were not designated. They further asked for specifics on equity metric information for those block groups. In response, STA staff suggested that they could develop a jurisdiction-specific breakdown of the equity framework data and could subsequently schedule individual follow-up discussions with committee members to discuss the data further and see if any corrections needed to be made. Committee members agreed with this approach.

Recommendation:

- Forward a recommendation to the STA TAC and STA Board to approve the following:
 - 1. The Solano Local Equity Indicator as proposed, which include the following factors:
 - 1. People of Color
 - 2. Low Income/Poverty
 - 3. Limited English Proficiency Population
 - 4. Zero-Vehicle Households
 - 5. Seniors (75 years and older)
 - 6. People with Disability
 - 7. Single-Parent Families
 - 8. Severely Rent-Burdened Households (>50% income goes to rent)
 - 9. Travel Time to Work (≥60 minutes)
 - 2. Incorporate a 5-point tiered scoring system using the Solano Local Equity Indicator and MTC's Equity Priority Communities (EPC) definition.
 - 3. Approve STA staff request to issue a letter from the STA Equity Working Group to MTC asking not to delete EPCs as part of the Plan Bay Area 2050+ EPC Update and instead only add newly designated EPCs.

Chair Vasquez made a motion (seconded by Michael Wilson) to approve the recommendation with a caveat that staff will schedule meetings with committee members to discuss jurisdiction-specific equity framework data.

5. PROXIMITY TO KEY DESTINATIONS

Kathrina Gregana, STA provided a summary of maps that were developed for the committee that showed the proximity of key destinations to equity areas in the County. Specifically, maps that show proximity to heath facilities, parks, and grocery stores were shown.

Committee Member/Public Comment:

Commissioner Gordon pointed out that South Vallejo is a food desert with no nearby grocery stores and further added that this very topic was discussed at the Vallejo City Council meeting the previous night. She asked STA staff to confirm the accuracy of the grocery store map for this area. Councilmember Peter Bregenzer echoed Commissioner Gordon's comments and request to double check the data.

Commissioner Gordon asked how grocery stores are being defined for the data set that was shown. Kathrina Gregana, STA responded that the description used was the "presence of vegetables." Committee members asked STA staff to broaden the grocery store definition being used to one that captures more food items and update the map accordingly.

Vice Mayor Okamura commented that the grocery store map being shown misleadingly shows good food access in Rio Vista, however, because SR-12 separates the community the northern side of the city has limited access.

Commissioner Gordon shared the importance of the proximity to destinations information for her meetings with MTC if these topics come up.

In response to the comments, STA staff will return to the committee with an updated grocery store map broken down by jurisdiction.

Committee members expressed their appreciation for the efforts that went into making the local equity criteria and these new maps.
