# A. Approval of the Active Transportation Committee (ATC) Meeting Minutes of July 17, 2024

On a motion by Mayor Hernandez, and a second by Mayor Young, the Active Transportation Committee approved the ATC meeting minutes of July 17, 2024.

A. Comprehensive Transportation Plan Schedule and Meeting Objectives (This item was presented as prelude to the next Agenda Item 5.B)
Presented by Robert Guerrero, STA.

**Summary of Committee Member Comments:** 

None.

#### B. Active Transportation Element Draft Goals and Objectives

Presented by Kathrina Gregana, STA.

#### Access Goal:

Dave Belef, STA SR2S Representative, on the last objective under this goal, suggested STA staff utilize the existing methodology to rate the pavement condition instead of developing a new index. Mr. Belef also encouraged committee members to consider how the goals and objectives for the active transportation element can have synergies with enhancing the safety of students getting to school.

Councilmember K. Patrice Williams inquired about the communication channels utilized to inform member agency staff about the Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) update process. In response, Robert Guerrero, STA, responded that member agency staff were kept apprised through STA committees, such as the Technical Advisory Committee and the Solano Planning Directors meetings. Additionally, individual meetings were held with both public works and planning staff from all eight Solano jurisdictions to discuss the CTP process and request project submittals.

Councilmember K. Patrice Williams requested clarification if active transportation was centered around increasing transit ridership. In response, Mr. Guerrero clarified that the focus of the active transportation projects not only includes expanding first and last mile connections to transit but also to key destinations in Solano County, such as schools, hospitals, downtowns, parks, and community resources.

#### Quality of Life Goal:

Chair Edwin Okamura, expressed his support in wanting to see safe routes to school projects that incorporate green infrastructure, noting that trees and shade would enhance the comfort of students walking to school in Rio Vista.

Bob Berman, STA PAC Representative, under the second objective, requested that STA staff strike out "where possible" and to define "pedestrian" in a CTP appendix that should be included in the plan. Mayor Steve Young concurred with Mr. Berman's request to define "pedestrian" in the appendix.

In response to Councilmember J.R. Matulac's question on how green infrastructure would be measured in active transportation projects, Mr. Guerrero discussed that the goals and objectives were intended to be broad and not too prescriptive to allow member agencies to have the autonomy to develop their active transportation projects. STA staff are available to assist member agencies in identifying opportunities to include green infrastructure in projects to advance the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions.

Chair Okamura commented that enhancing the local and regional trails in Solano County was essential in enhancing the well-being of Solano residents. He encouraged active transportation projects that connect to existing trails and future trail alignments.

#### Collaboration Goal:

Dave Belef, STA SR2S Representative, under the first objective, requested to include school districts in Solano County as a collaborative partner.

Mayor Steve Young inquired if STA staff considered combining the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committees into one joint committee. In response, Robert Guerrero discussed the value of having two separate committees7in providing their bicycle and pedestrian perspectives in enhancing active transportation in Solano County. Mr. Belef concurred with

this response and added to the discussion by explaining the roles of the committees and the yearly joint meetings.

In response to the inquiry posed by Councilmember J.R. Matulac on how funding is identified for projects, Mr. Guerrero discussed the STA's collaborative approach with its member agencies to identify grant opportunities that best align with their projects. As part of this process, STA staff also work with member agencies on how the STA's discretionary funds can be leveraged as a local match for larger State and Federal grants.

Forward a recommendation to the STA Board to approve the Active Transportation Element Draft Goals and Objectives.

## C. Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Update - Draft Project Prioritization Criteria

Presented by Kathrina Gregana, STA.

#### Summary of Committee Member Comments:

Below is a summary of the ATC's comments, which will be incorporated into the updated Draft Project Prioritization Criteria:

- Committee members noted that the project criteria heavily lean towards prioritizing Arterials, Highways, and Freeways (AHF) project types. To ensure active transportation projects are adequately prioritized, the committee requested that the active transportation criteria be strengthened, with an emphasis on local/regional trails.
- Under Table 2 of the Draft Project Prioritization Criteria, add additional weight to the Level of Traffic Stress criteria.
- Under the Accessibility Goal, it was suggested to add criteria for expansion and connecting the active transportation network to local and regional trails and parks.
- Under the Accessibility Goal, further clarification is needed on what "universal accessibility" encompasses.

Councilmember K. Patrice Williams requested clarification on whether the equity criteria used in the Draft Project Prioritization Criteria were consistent with MTC's definition of Equity Priority Communities (EPC). In response, Mr. Guerrero confirmed that the Solano Equity indicator is consistent with and builds upon MTC's EPCs, while also being locally tailored to the unique demographics and needs of Solano County.
