5. PRESENTATION

A. E-Bike Safety Curriculum

Pat Hines presented e-bike safety challenges, sharing data showing significant increases in e-bike crashes and injuries, particularly among young riders. Ms. Hines discussed the importance of proper helmet standards for higher-speed e-bikes and proposed collaboration between schools, law enforcement, and communities to develop and enforce e-bike policies.

Jason Gray requested resources from Ms. Hines for developing the curriculum at Dan Mini Elementary.

7. ACTION ITEMS- FINANCIAL

A. Authorization to Apply for One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) Cycle 4

Amy Antunano summarized that the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) released a call for projects for the One Bay Area grant, on its fourth cycle, which helps fund the SR2S program. Ms. Antunano highlighted the various programs and activities these funds support and the participation growth from all schools countywide.

Recommendation:

Forward a recommendation to the STA Board to authorize staff to apply for One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) Cycle 4 funding in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 to support the Solano Transportation Authority's SR2S program.

On a motion by Teri Booth and a second from Ana Petero, the SR2S-AC approved the recommendation. (9 Ayes)

8. ACTION ITEMS NON-FINANCIAL ITEMS

A. Solano Public Health Updated Scope of Work

Giselle Salinas-Zavala provided updates to the Solano Public Health scope of work for FY 2026-27.

9. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

A. Enforcement Status Updates

1. Benicia Police Department – CSOs shared the successful use of the new pedestrian bridge that has reduced the number of crossing guards needed. They continued to share a new pamphlet about e-bike classifications. <https://www.ci.benicia.ca.us/ebikes>

Teri Booth suggested displaying pamphlets on ferries to reach more commuters and parents.

2. Dixon Police Department - Absent
3. Fairfield Police Department - Absent
4. Suisun City Police Department - No update at this time.

B. OBAG-Cycle 4

Jasper Alve explained the funding criteria provided by the MTC guidelines and timeline. He highlighted and encouraged, as part of the evaluation criteria, project sponsors to obtain letters of support for grant applications.

C. Community Task Force Updates

1. City of Fairfield
Tina Machado shared that Fairfield's Traffic Engineering and Marketing Department attended SR2S's Fairfield Community Bike Fair and discussed the West Texas Complete Streets project, including recent median installations and future walk audits.
Ana Petero raised concerns about students riding bikes on Fulton Dr. in the Cordelia area.
2. City of Vacaville
Brant Beavers reported on Vacaville's implementation of Assembly Bill 382 – reduced speed zone signs near schools. He concluded with ongoing HSIP projects for enhanced pedestrian crossings at Vacaville High School and Orchard Elementary.

D. SR2S Program Coordinator Updates

1. Countywide Events
Janelle Gregorio presented on the National Bike and Roll to School Day annual event held on May 6, which saw 33 schools and nearly 3,000 students participate across the county. She noted a rise in helmet usage thanks to staff and partnerships. Additionally, she concluded that Walk to School Day is held in October
2. Benicia/Rio Vista/Travis AFB Unified School Districts (USD)
Ms. Gregorio provided updates on behalf of Leigh Moilanen, who was at a helmet fitting event at Center Elementary School. Ms. Moilanen will be participating in the Benicia Summer Reading Event on June 6th at the Benicia Library.
3. Dixon/ Fairfield-Suisun Unified School Districts
Crystal Peacher highlighted the partnership with Fairview Elementary School's "Read Across America" event. Ms. Peacher added she held a Safety Storytime event for 1st graders at Suisun Elementary. Ms. Peacher noted a turnout of 200 participants at the Dixon Community Bike Fair, where 47 bikes were repaired and 80 helmets were distributed free of cost for the community.

4. Vacaville/Vallejo Unified School Districts

Jayne Ziadeh participated in community events in Vallejo, highlighting Earth Day, Ribbon Cutting at Rise Vallejo, Family Fun Night at Vallejo Charter, and the Vallejo Community Bike Fair hosted at Dan Mini Elementary. The Vallejo Community Bike Fair saw over 120 participants – 27 riders participated in the Bike Rodeo, 23 bikes were serviced, and 31 helmets were distributed. The Vacaville Community Bike Fair was hosted by Markham Elementary and saw 280 participants – 17 riders participated in the Bike Rodeo, 17 bikes were serviced, and 46 helmets were distributed with the assistance of Vacaville PD. Will C. Wood High held a bike mobile event where 11 bikes were serviced and 2 helmets were distributed. Multiple Music Notes safety assemblies were also held at various schools in the first week of May.

Robert Guerrero highlighted the importance of the upcoming STA Board Workshop on July 8th at 3 pm to support OBAG funds for the program's continuation over the next four years.

E. Bay Area Air District (BAAD) Local Community Benefits Fund Grant

Amy Antunano summarized the Bay Reinvesting Penalties for Air Improvement and Resilience (REPAIR) Program. She indicated STA is partnering with Solano Public Health, the Cities of Benicia and Vallejo, in seeking \$1.6 million over three years for the BAAD grant.

F. Safe Streets and Roads 4 All (SS4A) Grant

Janelle Gregorio announced that the federal grant application is due May 26th, and since the application from the previous year was rated so highly but not awarded, that application will be updated and resubmitted with the recommended revisions from the reviewing committee.

Background:

The Solano Safe Routes to School (SR2S) Program aims to increase the number of students walking and bicycling to school to promote safe, healthy, and accessible travel options. Employing an inclusive strategy, the program incorporates six key elements, often referred to as the 6 E's: Education, Encouragement, Enforcement, Engineering, Engagement, and Evaluation. The program supports schools countywide with activities and programs that educate students about safety, promote health awareness, and identifies opportunities for community improvements ultimately enhancing safer travel for all.

Program Coordinator Update:

Between May and June, the Safe Routes to School (SR2S) program conducted a helmet fitting event at Cambridge Elementary School, hosted Bay Area Bike Mobiles at DH White Elementary School and Joe Henderson Elementary School, partnered with Safe Moves to offer a Bicycle Rodeo, and participated in the Benicia Library's Summer Days and Vibe and Thrive community events.

Across these events, SR2S staff distributed 70 helmets, serviced and repaired 46 bicycles, and shared information about Safe Routes to School programs, bicycle and pedestrian safety, and active transportation.

Background:

The Solano Safe Routes to School (SR2S) Program aims to increase the number of students walking and bicycling to school by promoting safe, healthy and accessible travel options. Employing an inclusive strategy, the program incorporates six key elements, often referred to as the 6 E's: education, encouragement, enforcement, engineering, engagement, and evaluation. The program supports schools countywide with activities and programs that educate students about safety, promote health awareness, and identify opportunities for community improvements ultimately enhancing safer travel for all.

The Solano SR2S Plan was first established in 2008 and later updated in 2013. Currently, the plan is undergoing another update in collaboration with various SR2S partners, the SR2S Community Task Forces, and the SR2S Countywide Advisory Committee, all of whom provide ongoing guidance to the program. Since its inception, the program has steadily grown, with more schools participating each year. It remains a vital service offered by the Solano Transportation Authority (STA) to each school district in the County.

Discussion:

On June 24th and July 22nd, SR2S kicked off and closed the Summer Reading Program "Smoothies for Teens" events at Dixon Public Library with the Solano Public Health Blender Bike. SR2S program information was shared with 59 cumulative participants. On July 21st, Bay Area Bike Mobile came to the Fairfield PAL Center to perform no-cost bike repairs and tune ups, 21 bikes were serviced.

On August 3rd and 6th, SR2S presented program information at the Fairfield- Suisun Unified School District (FSUSD) Joint Committee Meeting in Fairfield and Suisun City respectively. In August, SR2S staff participated in Assemblywoman Lori Wilson's "National Night Out" event engaging with 43 community members at One Harbor Center in Suisun City and in FSUSD's "Back to School" resource fair engaging with over 1000 FSUSD students and families at St. Mark's Church.

Background:

The Solano Safe Routes to School (SR2S) Program aims to increase the number of students walking and bicycling to school to promote safe, healthy, and accessible travel options. Employing an inclusive strategy, the program incorporates six key elements, often referred to as the 6 E's: Education, Encouragement, Enforcement, Engineering, Engagement, and Evaluation. The program supports schools countywide with activities and programs that educate students about safety, promote health awareness, and identifies opportunities for community improvements ultimately enhancing safer travel for all.

Program Coordinator Update:

Between May and July, SR2S staff continued bicycle and pedestrian safety outreach through school and community events. Activities included a Safety Storytime at KI Jones Elementary in Fairfield, where 24 students learned safe walking and biking habits. Photos can be viewed in Attachment A.

SR2S staff also participated in the Trucks of the Trade event at the Vacaville Cultural Center Library, where staff shared information about Safe Routes to School programs and bicycle and pedestrian safety resources with approximately 200 families. Photos can be viewed in Attachment B.

Lastly, SR2S staff delivered 22 bicycle helmets to the Vacaville Police Department to support their community helmet distribution efforts.

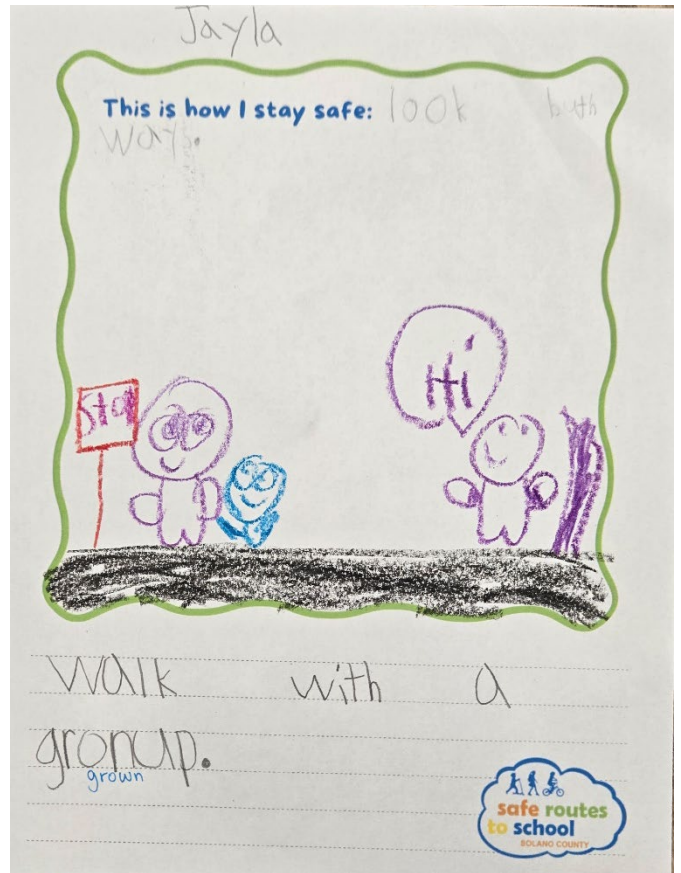
