(CMAQ) Pedestrian Priority Project Selection

Background:

The One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) program is a funding program for federal transportation dollars which allows 45% of the total funding for the region (Bay Area) to be distributed to Bay Area Congestion Management Agencies (CMAs).

Discussion:

At its meeting of September 14, 2016, the STA Board issued a Call for Projects for OBAG 2 funds. The Call for Projects is for \$4,646,003 of CMAQ funds with funds to be distributed on a competitive basis, using the criteria approved by the Board at the same time.

The Call for Projects is open for eight weeks – from September 15th through November 18, 2016.

The purpose of the October 12 workshop and board meeting agenda item is to allow members of the general public and the STA advisory committees to provide input to the STA board regarding what are their recommended priorities for OBAG 2 funding. Members of the public are requested to keep their comments to no more than 2 minutes. STA advisory committees are requested to keep their presentations to no more than 5 minutes.

The meetings also provide an opportunity for STA board members to ask questions of project advocates, and to give advocates adequate time to revised or clarify their application prior to the November 18 submittal deadline. No action will be taken at this time.

The PAC has previously identified the Tier 1 and Tier 2 priority projects. This list captures the projects most likely to be considered by the committee as the project the PAC supports. Other considerations for the committee include the project readiness, total cost of the project, matching funds available, and support for priority transit, development, or conservation projects.

It is important to note that each project will need a project sponsor: either a city or a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) such as SolTrans. Therefore, if a project is identified by a committee, but the appropriate project sponsor does not concur, the project will not receive funding from the STA Board. The PAC should identify a primary and secondary priority.

Attached are the criteria that STA staff will use to evaluate proposed projects and the PAC's approved priority project list of projects eligible for OBAG 2 CMAQ funding.

Fiscal Impact:

None at this time. The project selected will eventually be considered for funding by the STA Board.

Background:

At the June 2, 2016 PAC meeting, the PAC requested a discussion of pedestrian safety issues for the August 4, 2016 PAC meeting for several locations in Suisun City. STA staff and the PAC chair determined that a walking tour was recommended.

Discussion:

The following discussion took place during the walking tour. Notes will be forwarded to the STA Safe Routes to School Advisory Committee.

General comments were made by many of the routes kids take to get to and from school, often times cutting through parking lots and across vacant fields.

At Driftwood Dr. and Josiah Cr. FAST (city) buses are blocked from accessing the bus stop due to parents illegally parking in front of the bus stop, waiting for school kids. Nick Lozano from Suisun Public Works said they can address this issue in the next week by painting the curb red or posting signs. Commander Andrew White from Suisun Police Department also said they can make that area a focus of enforcement.

The upcoming Driftwood Dr. Project that runs along the north side of the school property hopes to direct students walking to use the multi-use path and not scatter throughout the neighborhood.

Many issues were discussed at the corner of Marina Blvd. and Highway 12. Kids take great risks as they try to run across Hwy 12 before the pedestrian signal ends. The activated pedestrian signal stops east/westbound automobile traffic, causing backups before and after school. An overcrossing or undercrossing would help separate the intersection and allow traffic of all kinds to move more consistently, but the costs are likely prohibitive. A less expensive solution of utilizing crossing guards would help encourage safe behavior at that corner.

There was much discussion about high school kids unsafely crossing the railroad tracks separating Fairfield and Suisun City. The route many high school students take to school on foot find it prohibitively long to walk to either the pedestrian bridge near the Suisun Amtrak station (connecting Main Street in Suisun City to Union Street in Fairfield)and then back track to Armijo High School (approximately 1.7 miles/32 minutes according to Google Maps). Students walk north on Marina Blvd. then cross the railroad tracks where the fence has been cut away. This is a larger issue that has a complicated, and likely expensive solution which will be addressed in the future. It was good for the committee and staff to see these challenges firsthand.

After the walking tour, discussion continued back at STA office about Crystal Middle School (located on Driftwood Drive) and the challenges it faces with parents picking up students, Marina Blvd, and bus circulation patterns. Commander White of Suisun PD said that the Safe Routes to School enforcement grant will provide funding to have an enforcement officer onsite occasionally to address some of the behavior-based challenges. This will include assemblies and bike rodeos, acknowledging the challenge of tailoring the Safe Routes to School curriculum to middle school kids.

Comments from Jim Antone (Safe Routes to School Advisory Committee Chair)

- As of the Safe Routes to School Event Participation spread sheet for FY 2015-16 provided at the May 18 SR2S Advisory Committee meeting, Crystal Middle School has not participated in any of the education, encouragement or engagement events, although 14 classrooms participated in the Oct. 2015 Travel Surveys. Additional efforts may be needed to facilitate this school's participation in the appropriate events.
- Enhanced education and enforcement efforts by the Suisun City Police Dept. emphasizing appropriate and inappropriate pick-up and drop-off locations outside of school bus zones and transit stops near the school may be needed. Additional remote drop-off and/or pick-up locations may need to be identified.
- How are students getting to Crystal that live within easy bike or walking distance/south of SR12? These students/parents should be a high priority for targeting any desired behavioral changes.
- The planned multi-use pathway/cycle track project along the south side of Driftwood drive: If lane striping on the street is removed for this project they should be replaced with shared lane markings, or "sharrows" placed at regular intervals on the street in both directions on Driftwood drive. Shared lane markings will signify that this local street remains open to all users of the road including bicycling students and other cycling community members.
- The installation of sidewalks on Marina Boulevard between SR 12 and Buena Vista Lane for students accessing Crystal Middle School from north of SR 12 is a significant existing need in terms of safety and convenience. This should be a higher priority than the cycle track/bike path planned along the north side of Lotz way connecting to the Amtrak station. The Central County Bikeway currently provides bike/ped access to the train station for a significant portion of the SR 12 corridor in this area.
- Since a significant portion of Crystal Middle School students live north of SR 12, the intersection of SR12 and Marina Boulevard will continue to be a safety issue, choke point and barrier for students bicycling and walking to and from school. It will also continue to cause significant congestion and inconvenience for SR 12 motorists at least during peak before and after school hours. Congestion will be an even greater factor if more students are driven to and from school in the future. A longer term look may require the study of a variety of design options and potential solutions for this corridor and intersection which may including but not necessarily limited to signal timing, enhanced cross walk treatments/parallel crosshatch striping and/or colored textured crosswalks with refuge islands, protected or "Dutch" style intersection, traffic circle or a grade separation connecting the Central County Bikeway with the Grizzly Island Trail in the vicinity of this intersection.

Comments from Nick Lozano (City of Suisun City)

- The curbs at the bus shelters on Driftwood Drive at Josiah Circle *have been painted red*. One of the police officers here indicated that we would need to install BUS LOADING ZONE signs as well. Before I finalize the work order I'll verify this with Commander Andrew White.
- The two overgrown trees along the Grizzly Island Trail segment along Marina Boulevard between Driftwood Court and Lotz Way *have been pruned for now*. About a year and a half ago our then City Arborists approved their removal. The two trees will be removed when our crew has free time in its schedule. In other words, I will not make this a high priority item as this does not present a safety issue. I have to be mindful of our crew's busy schedule.
- The overgrown tree by the southwest corner of Driftwood Drive and Marina Boulevard is a private tree, *and has been pruned*.

Comments from Lloyd Nadal (STA Safe Routes to School Program Administrator)

- 1) I followed up with April to contact Crystal Middle School's Principal to gauge their involvement in Safe Routes this year. They weren't as active in the past and want to make sure they are aware and engaged in the Infrastructure project(s) moving forward.
- 2) Suisun City PD Per Drew's suggestion, I'm going to see if Office Gonzalez (or staff) can create a flyer showing potential drop off locations for parents and where they can and cannot park. Through our Enforcement Grant with them for the next 2 years, we will continue to support the PD's effort in educating the community around the promotion of walking and addressing barriers/challenges.
- 3) After we get more clear on the railroad situation and if it makes sense, I'm going to contact representatives from Armijo HS to gauge their interest in creating a safer walkway to the high school (especially young people coming south of SR12). The SR2S Program is planning to support 3-5 youth engagement HS pilots across the County this year and perhaps this could be one or at least a project of interest for Suisun City in the next SR2S 2018 Plan.

Section 1. Meetings/Attendance (Bylaws)

The PAC shall hold a regular meeting at least once a calendar year quarter and as necessary to fulfill the mandate of Article III, Sections 1 and 2. Members of the PAC that do not attend three scheduled meetings in succession and do not contact staff to indicate that they will not be present is considered to be an 'un-contacted absence' and may have their position declared vacant by the STA Board of Directors. Absence after contacting staff is considered a 'contacted absence.' Contacted absences and un-contacted absences shall be documented in the minutes of each meeting. If a PAC member has missed a combination of four contacted and un-contacted absences in any one-year period, he or she will be sent a written notice of intent to declare the position vacant. If there is no adequate response before or at the next scheduled meeting, and based upon a recommendation from the PAC, the position may be declared vacant by the STA Board.
